Maths	<p>Activity</p> <p>Focus: Numbers to 20</p> <p>Play 'Dinosort' online here <a href="https://ictgames.com/mobilePage/dinoSorts/index.html">https://ictgames.com/mobilePage/dinoSorts/index.html</a></p> <p>Children place the numbers in the correct order on the dinosaur's back.</p> <p>If they are right the volcano will erupt, otherwise the dinosaur will grow! Start from different numbers to 20</p>	<p>Activity</p> <p>Focus: How many now?</p> <p>Count out 5 objects such as dinosaurs, buttons, lego pieces. Ask your child to check how many there are. Cover the objects with a cloth. Then, add a hidden number of the same objects under the cloth. Show your child how many objects there are now. Challenge them to work out how many objects were added, using their fingers or by making marks on paper.</p>	<p>Activity</p> <p>Focus: Shape Patterns</p> <p>Play <a href="#">Shape Patterns</a></p>	<p>Activity</p> <p>Focus: Number bonds to 10</p> <p>Can you remember the pairs of numbers that always go together to make 10?</p> <p>Could you thread the different amounts of beads on a pipe cleaner using 2 colours? Maybe you could make 2 pens of farm animals which together make 10 or simply write on the number sentences as a list?</p>
Curriculum	<p>Over the next couple of weeks, we are finding out about animals including their similarities and differences. Encourage your child to write a list of 5 different animals. They could then ask members of the family which is their favourite animal from the list. Which animal was the most popular? Do you have a pet at home? Could you use a photo of your pet and write simple sentences to explain how they need to be looked after? Alternatively, find out and write an interesting fact about an animal of your choosing.
